Safety

Before you use your phone, read the following safety messages.

Turn o your phone in restricted areas

Turn o your phone in areas where the use of mobile phones is not allowed.

Be safe on the road

Obey all local laws. Do not use your phone while driving or in control of a vehicle, unless you use a hands free device.

Radio waves can cause interference

Your phone emits radio waves, which may interfere with other electronic devices. Interference from other electronic devices may a ect your network signal.

Keep your phone clean and dry

Do not use your phone in dusty or dirty conditions. Do not get your phone wet, or use it in areas with high humidity or moisture.


Leave it to the professionals



Getting Started.

Before you can use your phone for the first time, you need to do the following:


- 1. Insert a SIM card into your phone
- 2. Charge your phone fully
- 3. Turn your phone on
- 4. Follow the start-up guide on your phone

Inserting your SIM card

Your MP 01 phone is designed for use with micro-SIM (3FF) cards. If you have a nano-SIM card, use the SIM adapter that is provided in your phone box. Punkt. recommends that you do not permanently use the SIM adapter.


Warning: Only use micro-SIM cards or the provided SIM adapter. If you use another type of SIM card, you may damage your phone or SIM card.

Before you insert your SIM card, turn o your phone and unplug the micro USB cable. Read more about turning your phone o on page 8.



- 1. Insert the SIM tray pin into the hole on your phone, until the SIM tray pops out.
- 2. Pull the SIM tray carefully to remove it from your phone.
- 3. Place your SIM card into the SIM tray, with the metal side of the SIM card facing down.
- 4. Insert the SIM tray back into your phone and push it in until you feel it click into place.

Getting Started.



Charging your phone

You can easily charge your phone with the provided micro USB cable. Before you turn your phone on for the first time, charge it fully.

- 1. Open the cover of the USB port ⊕ on your phone.
- 2. İnsert the micro USB cable into the USB port.
- 3. Insert the other end of the micro USB cable into the USB charger.
- 4. Connect the USB charger to a power outlet. Your phone starts to charge. The phone displays **Battery charging** and the current battery level.

Tip: You can also use a computer's USB port to charge your phone. If your phone is on when you connect it to a computer, press \odot to charge it.

Turning your phone on or o

— To turn your phone on

- Press and hold the lock button

 on the side of the phone, until the screen turns on.
- 2. If your phone has a passcode, enter it with the keypad.
- 3. If your SIM card has a PIN, enter it with the keypad.
- 4. Read more about passcodes and PINs on page 29.

— To turn your phone o

Press and hold the lock button e on the side of the phone. If your phone displays a confirmation message, press \bigcirc .

Start-up guide

When you turn your phone on for the first time, a start-up guide appears. This start-up guide sets up your phone so you can start using it.

- 1. Use $\bigotimes \odot$ to choose a language and press \bigcirc .
- 2. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to choose a clock format and press \bigcirc .
- - a. Choose the hour, then press \odot .
 - b. Choose the minute, then press \odot .
 - c. If you use a 12-hour clock, choose AM or PM and press ⊙.
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to set the date.
- 5. Your phone is now ready to use.
 To continue choosing settings on your phone, select Settings and press ⊙.
 - To start using your phone, select Later and press \odot .

Getting Started.

Locking or unlocking your phone's keypad

When your phone is in your pocket or bag, you can accidentally press keys or buttons. To prevent this from happening, lock your phone's keypad.

Tip: You can set your phone's keypad to lock automatically after a certain amount of time. Read more about automatic locking on page 29.

- To lock your phone's keypad, press the lock button (a) on the side of the phone. When the keypad is locked, your phone displays the **a** status icon.
- To unlock your phone's keypad, press and hold the lock button a on the side of the phone.

Connecting a headset

Sometimes you might want to use your phone but keep your hands free. You can use your phone with the following:

· A micro USB headset

 A Bluetooth enabled device, for example, a Bluetooth headset or the audio system in your car. Read more about connecting your phone to a Bluetooth device on page 27.

When a headset is connected to your phone, your phone displays the Λ status icon.

- To connect a micro USB headset

- 1. Open the cover of the USB port \bigcirc on your phone.
- 2. Insert the micro USB headset into the USB port.

Tip: To connect a pair of headphones with a 3.5 mm connector, use the provided converter.

Your Home Screen.



About your Home screen

When you turn on your phone, it displays your Home screen. Your Home screen displays a clock and notifications.

To return to your Home screen from any other screen, press \otimes .

When the current time and date is selected, press \odot to open the main menu.

Note: All of the steps described in this user guide assume you start on your Home screen, with the current time and date selected.

Status icons

Your phone displays the following status icons at the top of your Home screen.

Notifications

Your Home screen displays notifications. You can receive notifications for calls, text messages, reminders, and alarms.

To view more information about a notification on your Home screen

- 1. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select a notification and press \bigcirc .
- If you press ⊙ again, your phone displays content or a list of options. For example, for a reminder notification, you can delete or edit the reminder, or add an alert.

You can choose when to receive notifications. Choose to never receive notifications, always receive them, or only receive them when your phone's keypad is unlocked.

— To change your


- notification settings
- 1. Press \odot .
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Preferences and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Notifications and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Choose when to receive notifications and press \odot to save.

Shortcut menu

From your Home screen, you can change common settings with the shortcut menu. Use the shortcut menu to quickly turn vibrate and Bluetooth on or o $\,$, or change your network settings.

· To view the shortcut menu, press and hold \otimes on your Home screen.

Making calls

- To call a phone number
- 1. Use the keypad to enter a phone number. 2. Press \mathfrak{S} .

— To call someone in your call history

- 1. Press \cong .
- 2. Choose a phone number or contact and press \mathfrak{S} .

— To call a contact

- 1. Press (...).
- 2. Choose a contact and press \bigcirc .
- 3. If the contact has multiple phone numbers, choose a phone number and press \mathfrak{S} .

Ending calls

· To end a call, press \mathfrak{B} .

Options

Answering calls

- · To answer a call, press \mathfrak{S} .
- To answer a call with your phone on loudspeaker, press and hold .

Tip: To change your ringtone, see page 25.

Rejecting calls

When you do not want to answer a call, you have several options.

- To silence a call, press either of the volume buttons on the side of your phone.
- · To reject a call, press ⊗.
- To reject a call and send a text message to the caller a. Press (•).
- b. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Send message and press \odot .
- c. Choose a text message template and press \odot .
- To set a reminder for you to call the caller back
 - a. Press (•).
 - b. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Remind me and press \odot . The reminder is shown on your Home screen. Read more about reminders on page **23**.

Calls.

Multiple calls

Sometimes you might receive a call when you are already on a call. If call waiting is on, when you are on a call and receive a new call, you can put the current call on hold and answer the new one. You can also make a new call when you are already on a call.

Note: Not all network providers or contracts allow you to handle multiple calls. For more information, contact your network provider.

— To answer or reject calls when you are already on a call

- To answer the new call, press ⊜. The current call is put on hold.
- To see other options, for example, rejecting the new call and sending a text message to the caller, press \odot .

— To make a new call when you are already on a call

- To call a phone number, enter it with the keypad and press . The current call is put on hold.
- To call a contact, press ^(B). Then choose a contact and press ^(C). The current call is put on hold.

— To turn call waiting on or o

- 1. Press ().
- 2. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Calls and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Call waiting and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Choose Activate or Deactivate, then press ⊙.

Tip: To check your current setting for call waiting, choose Query status and press \odot .

$\frac{\text{Changing the volume}}{\text{of a call}}$

When you are on a call, you can change the volume of the call or put it on loudspeaker.

- To change the volume of a call, use the volume buttons on the side of the phone.
- To put a call on loudspeaker, press \odot . Use $\odot \odot$ to select Turn speaker on and press \odot .

Muting your microphone

• To mute your microphone, press \odot . Use $\odot \boxdot$ to select Turn mute on and press \odot .

Putting calls on hold

- · To put a call on hold, press \circledast .
- To resume the call, press \bigcirc .

Using speed dial numbers

Speed dial numbers allow you to instantly call a phone number or contact, at the touch of a key. Read about adding and deleting speed dial numbers on page 17.

To call a speed dial number, press and hold the assigned key. For example, to dial the phone number or contact in speed dial position 2, press and hold ⁽²⁾.

Tip: Speed dial position 1 is assigned to your voicemail. Read about checking your voicemail on page **15**.

Viewing your call history

Your call history shows recent calls that you have made and received.

1. Press 🔿.

- 2. To call someone in your call history, choose a call and press ⊜.
- 3. To view the details of a call, choose a call and press ⊙. From the **Options** menu you can call the phone number, send a text message, or add it to your contacts list.

Showing or hiding your phone number on outgoing calls

To hide your phone number when you make a call, hide your caller ID. When your phone number is hidden, the person who you are calling cannot see your number.

Note: Not all network providers or contracts allow you to change the caller ID settings. For more information, contact your network provider.

- 1. Press •.
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Calls and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Caller ID and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Choose to show or hide your phone number, or use your network provider's settings. Then press ⊙.

Diverting calls

You can divert calls to another number or to your voicemail. You can choose from the following settings:

- Divert calls when you do not answer
- Divert calls when you are busy
- Divert calls when you do not have network signal
- · Divert all calls

Note: Not all network providers or contracts allow you to change the divert call settings. For more information, contact your network provider.

— To divert calls to another number or to your voicemail

- 1. Press \odot .
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Calls and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use *○ ⊙* to select Divert calls and press *⊙*.
- 5. Choose a divert setting, then press ⊙.
- 6. Choose Activate, then press \odot .

Tip: To check the current divert setting, choose Query status and press \odot .

7. Choose where to divert calls and then follow the on-screen instructions.

To cancel all diverts

- 1. Press \odot .
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select **Calls** and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Divert calls and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Use $\bigcirc \bigtriangledown$ to select Cancel all diverts and press \bigcirc .

Voicemail.

Checking your voicemail

When you do not answer a call, the caller can leave a message on your voicemail provided by your network provider. When someone leaves a message on your voicemail, you receive a text message.

Note: Your voicemail settings depend on your network provider or contract. For more information, contact your network provider.

 \cdot To check your voice mail, press and hold (1).

Setting your voicemail number

Before you can check your voicemail, you need to set your voicemail number. Your voicemail number is specific to the network provider of your SIM card. If you do not know your voicemail number, contact your network provider.

1. Press \odot .

- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Settings and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Voicemail and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Enter your voicemail number and press \odot .

Contacts.

About contacts

You can save the phone numbers for family and friends as contacts on your phone. A contact can have up to three phone numbers assigned to it, each with a di erent label. For example, your friend might have a home phone number and a work phone number.

Adding contacts

To add a new contact, you can use your contacts list or the dialler.

- To add a new contact from your contacts list
 Press (a).
- Use

 is a ress
 is ress
 is a ress
- Enter the phone number and press twice ⊙.
- 4. Choose a label for the phone number and press ⊙.
- 5. Enter the contact name and press
 ⊙ twice to save the contact. To add another phone number to the contact, see page 16.
- To add a new contact from the dialler
- 1. Use the keypad to enter a phone number.
- 2. Press \odot .
- 3. Use *○ ⊙* to select Add to contacts and press *○* twice.
- 4. If required, edit the phone number.
- 5. Press \odot twice.
- 6. Choose a label for the phone number and press \odot .
- 7. Enter the contact name.
- 8. Press \odot twice to save the contact.

To add another phone number to the contact, see page 16.

Viewing contacts

1. To view your contacts list, press @.

Tip: To search for a contact in the list, use the keypad to enter the name of the contact.

2. To view the phone numbers for a contact, choose a contact and press \odot .

Editing contacts

You can edit the name of a contact, edit their phone number, or add another phone number.

— To edit the name of a contact

- 1. Press 🚇.
- 2. Choose a contact and press ⊙ twice.
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Edit and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Edit name and press \bigcirc .

5. Edit the contact name and press ⊙ twice to save.

— To edit the phone number of a contact

- 1. Press .
- 2. Choose a contact and press ⊙ twice.
- If there are multiple phone numbers for a contact, choose the number to edit and press ⊙.
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Edit number and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Edit the phone number and press twice.
- 6. Choose a label for the phone number and press ⊙ to save.

To add another phone number to a contact

- 1. Press @.
- 2. Choose a contact and press ⊙ twice.
- 4. Use ⊚ ⊚ to select Add number and press ⊙.
- 5. Enter the phone number and press \odot twice.
- 6. Choose a label for the phone number and press ⊙ to save.

Contacts.

Deleting contacts

- 1. Press 🐵.
- 2. Choose a contact and press \odot twice.

Sharing contacts

You can share a contact with family and friends. Choose to send the contact details in a text message or send them by Bluetooth.

- 1. Press 🕮.
- 2. Choose a contact and press ⊙ twice.
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Share and press \bigcirc .
- 4. To choose how to share the contact, use $\bigcirc \boxdot$.

To send the contact details in a text message, select Share via message and press ⊙. Choose a recipient and then follow the on-screen instructions. Read more about text messages on page 19.

 To send the contact details by Bluetooth, select Share via Bluetooth and press ⊙. Choose another device and then follow the on-screen instructions. Read more about Bluetooth on page 27.

Receiving a shared contact with Bluetooth

When someone uses Bluetooth to send you a contact, your phone displays a notification. After you receive the shared contact, add it to your contacts list. Read more about Bluetooth on page **27**.

- To receive the shared contact, choose Yes and then press ⊙. A vCard format (.vcf) file is saved on your phone.
- 2. Press .
- 3. Use *△ ⊙* to select Manage contact and press *○*.
- 4. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select **Restore** contacts and press \bigcirc .
- 5. Choose the .vcf file and press ⊙ to add it to your contacts list.

Viewing your own phone number

You can view your own phone number in your contacts list.

Note: For some SIM cards, you cannot view your own phone number in your contacts list. To check your own phone number, contact your network provider.

• To view your own phone number, press (a). Your phone number is displayed at the top of the list.

Adding and deleting speed dial numbers

You can add phone numbers or contacts that you call a lot to speed dial numbers. Your voicemail is always assigned to speed dial number 1.

- 1. Press 🐵.
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Manage contact and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to select Speed dial and press \bigcirc .
- 4. To add a phone number or a contact to a speed dial number, choose an unassigned number and press ⊙.
- 5. To delete a speed dial number, choose a number and press \odot .

Contacts.

Copying and moving contacts between your phone and SIM card

- To copy contacts between your phone and SIM card
- 1. Press @.
- 2. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Manage contact and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use ⓐ ⊚ to select Copy contacts and press ⊙.
- 4. Choose where to copy contacts to, then press \odot .
- 5. Choose to copy individual contacts or all contacts, then press ⊙.
 - If you are copying individual contacts, choose the contact and press \odot to copy it. To copy another contact, press \odot .
 - If you are copying all contacts, press \odot to start.

- To move contacts between your phone and SIM card
- 1. Press 🕮.
- 2. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Manage contact and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Move contacts and press \bigcirc .
- 4. Choose where to move contacts to, then press (a).
- 5. Choose to move individual contacts or all contacts, then press ⊙.
 - If you are moving individual contacts, choose the contact and press \odot to move it. To move
 - another contact, press ⊙. • If you are moving all contacts,
 - press \odot to start.

Backing up and restoring contacts

You can back up your contacts list to a computer and then restore it at a later date. Your phone can use backups in the vCard format (.vcf).

Tip: Read more about backing up and restoring contacts at punkt.ch. When your phone backs up your contacts list, it saves it as a .vcf file.

It names the backup with the current date and time. For example, a backup created on 11th March 2016 at 14:35:07 has the name Punkt20160311143507.

— To back up your contacts list to a computer

- 1. Press .
- 2. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Manage contact and press \bigcirc .
- Use ^(a) ^(c) ^{(c}
- 4. Use the micro USB cable to connect your phone to a computer.
- 6. Copy the backup file from your phone to the computer.
- To restore your contacts list from a computer
- 1. Use the micro USB cable to connect your phone to a computer.
- 3. Copy the backup file from the computer to your phone.
- 4. Disconnect your phone from the computer.

5. Press 🐵.

- 6. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select Manage contact and press \bigcirc .
- 7. Use \bigcirc \bigcirc to select **Restore** contacts and press \bigcirc .
- 8. Choose a backup and press ⊙ to restore it.

Text Messages.

About text messages

Text messages allow you to keep in touch with family and friends. When you send and receive text messages, your phone saves them in folders so you can easily find them. Your phone uses the following folders for text messages.

— Inbox

Text messages that you have received.

Drafts

Text messages that you have started but not sent.

— Outbox

Text messages that you are currently sending or text messages that have failed to send.

- Sent

Text messages that you have sent.

- Templates

Text messages that you can quickly send.

Tip: You can save up to 1000 text messages on your phone.

Entering text on your phone

To enter text on your phone, use the keypad. Each number key represents several letters. For example, you can use the ⁽²⁾ key to enter the letters *a*, *b*, or *c*. You can enter text in the following ways:

- Predictive text
- Multi-tap text



When you enter text, press (*) to cycle through the text entry modes. Your phone cycles through the modes in the following order.

1. JAbc

— **Predictive text** Capitalise the first letter

2. JABC

— Predictive text All upper case letters

3. Jabc — Predictive text

All lower case letters

Abc

 Multi-tap text
 Capitalise the first letter

- 5. ABC — Multi-tap text All upper case letters
- $6. \ \mathrm{abc}$

— Multi-tap text All lower case letters 123

7. 123 — Number **Tip:** To instantly swap between predictive and multi-tap modes, press and hold ①.

Note: If your phone is not in English, the first two letters of your phone's language is used to display the text entry mode.

— To use multi-tap text entry

To enter a letter, press a key. Each time you press the key, it cycles through the associated letters. For example, to enter the letter *c*, press (2) three times.

— To use predictive text entry

With predictive text, you can press fewer keys to enter a word.

- 1. To enter a letter, press a key once. As you continue to press keys, your phone suggests words at the bottom of your screen.
- 2. To choose the suggested word that is highlighted in orange, press \odot .
- 3. To choose another suggested word, use \bigcirc \bigcirc and then press \bigcirc .

Tip: To choose a word and also insert a space after it, press ⁽¹⁾.

When you use predictive text input, is displayed in the top-right of your screen.

Text Messages.

— To enter other characters

- To enter a space between words, press (9).
- To enter a full stop, press (1).
- To enter a number, press and hold a key. You can also press (*) multiple times until the phone is in number mode.
- To view a list of symbols, press
 ⊙. Then press the relevant key to insert a symbol, or press ⊙ to view the next page of symbols.

Sending text messages

You can send a text message to a phone number or contact. To send the text message to more than one person, add multiple phone numbers or contacts to the recipient list.

- 1. Press .
- 2. Press •.
- 3. Enter your message and press ⊙ twice.
- 4. To choose who to send the text message to, use \bigcirc \bigcirc .
 - To send the text message to a phone number, select **Enter number** and press \odot . Enter the phone number and press \odot .

- To send the text message to a contact, select **Add from Phonebook** and press \odot . Choose a contact and press \odot . If the contact has multiple phone numbers, choose a number and press \odot .
- 5. When you have added all of the recipients, press ⊙ twice to send the text message.

Tip: If your phone cannot send the text message, a message appears. Your phone saves the message to your outbox folder.

Viewing text messages

— To view a new text message

When you receive a new text message, a notification appears on your Home screen. To open the text message, press \odot .

Tip: To change your message tone, see page 25.

— To view text messages in a message folder

- 1. Press .
- 2. Use $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ to choose a message folder, then press \bigcirc .

3. To view a text message, choose a message and press ⊙.

Tip: If you want to call the person who sent you the text message, you can quickly call them from the message. To call the person who sent you the text message, press \odot . Select **Call** and then press \odot .

Replying to or forwarding text messages

- 1. View a text message.

How To Take Care Of Your MP 01 Mobile Phone.

For best performance, store your phone in temperatures between 15 $^{\circ}$ C and 25 $^{\circ}$ C.

Do not expose your phone to temperatures lower than 0 °C and higher than 40 °C. Exposure to extreme temperatures may cause your phone to stop working temporarily. Prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures may damage your phone or battery.

Keep your phone clean and dry. Do not use or store your phone in wet, dirty, or dusty conditions. If your phone gets dirty, use a soft and clean cloth to clean it.

Keep your phone away from sources of heat. Do not expose the battery to fire, as it may explode. Take care not to drop, impact, or shock your phone. If your phone is damaged, do not use it.

Do not open, dismantle, or modify your phone in any way, other than that described in this user guide.

Only use your phone and accessories as described in this user guide.

When you use your phone, hold it so your hand does not cover the antenna area. If you cover the antenna area, it may a ect your network signal.
