Samsung Galaxy S6 Edge

The most stunning Android phone yet, the Galaxy S6 Edge has a 5.1-inch display that is slightly smaller than the iPhone 6s Plus', but it packs more pixels for stunning, crisp images. The camera is superb, with an f/1.9 aperture for better results in low light. And it boasts fingerprint recognition. What truly sets the phone apart, though, is its wireless charging ability: It's compatible with both of the big wireless charging standards (WPC and PMA), so it works with the very widest range of charging mats that are increasingly found in hotels. HTC One M9

This sleek Android smartphone boasts an outstanding design, with a curved metal body meant to last and Gorilla Glass protecting its 5-inch display. Cameras are 20 megapixels on the rear and 4 megapixels on the front. But its strongest suit is music. It can store your entire collection with ease (it has 32GB of storage that can be expanded affordably with a microSD card) and, unusually, its front-facing built-in speakers do a good job reproducing sound. Apple iPhone 6s Plus

If you're a fan of Apple—its sleek, industrial design, its intuitive operating system, its expensive smart watch—you want either this or the smaller 6s. This update on the 6 Plus retains the larger "phablet" form factor with a 5.5-inch display and doesn't cost a penny more than its predecessor. It adds clever 3-D touch controls that can differentiate between light taps and strong presses. Plus, it has a faster processor, a better camera (12 megapixels, 4K video) and more.
